

“Smudge” 18 year old neutered male white domestic shorthair cat

Smudge was first examined July 20th 2004, at the age of 14 years. He had an advanced nasal solar squamous cell carcinoma, involving the right side of the nose and advancing up the bridge of the nose toward the medial canthus of the right eye. Symptoms included pain, weight loss, constantly sneezing with bleeding and spraying blood everywhere when he sneezed, poor appetite and lethargy. The cancer had eroded the nasal turbinates and cartilage of the right nare.

He also had early carcinoma lesions on the ear tips, which did not appear painful or ulcerated.

Energetic testing (biotensor) indicated positive responses to BICOM bio-resonance therapy, a raw food diet, and oral vitamin C, and pH modification using Hydronium solution pH 2.2.

BICOM therapy was initiated on July 30th, 2004. The first therapy included programs for Basic therapy #126, Geopathic stress #700, Lymph activation #830 and #930. Hydronium H3O pH 2.2 was dispensed to mix into his raw food.

On August 10th, BICOM therapy was repeated, using programs for Basic therapy #123 and Mesenchyme therapy #433. The cancer site had scabbed over, which was unusual in that it had never kept a scab on prior to initiating therapy. Smudge’s appetite had improved, but was still not consistent so he wasn’t getting the Hydronium solution every day.

On September 24th, Smudge was “holding steady” with no worsening of the lesion. He was eating well, gaining weight and more interactive with the family. His comfort level had also improved. BICOM therapy programs for Pituitary gland regulation #916, Tissue process chronic degenerative #923, and Pancreas impairment #935 were run. The owner was instructed to continue the raw food diet and Hydronium solution orally.

BICOM therapy was repeated on November 16th. Programs for Basic therapy #133, Radiation stress #702 and a program for relieving emotional blocks (902, with parameters of H 2.3 +Di 1.5, 82 kHz wobbling, increasing levels, continuous mode, 34 seconds per level) were performed. The lesion was still static, with no further growth and some evidence of healing present. Smudge was comfortable, eating well and continuing to gain weight.

At a re-check appointment December 28th, the cancer site was observed to be healing over and hair was growing over the site. His appetite was variable, and he didn’t eat well for 2 weeks after the death of another cat in the household. No BICOM therapy was done at this appointment, but he required a chiropractic adjustment.

Healing continued to progress over the next 5 months, with occasional Bach flower remedies and homeopathic remedies dispensed to treat symptoms as they appeared. On May 3rd, May 24th and June 21st 2005 BICOM therapies were performed to address new lesions on the left side of the nose, which were presumed to be carcinomas as well. Programs used included Basic therapies 122, 124 and 125, Pituitary regulation 916, and potentiation of discharge from the eyes stored into eye ointment. This resulted in regression of the lesion on the left side of the nose. At this point the right side of the nose had completely healed.

In 2006 and 2007, Smudge had his ear tips amputated while anesthetized for dental procedures. The lesions on the ear tips did not go away with the BICOM therapy, so amputation was done prophylactically. He has developed chronic renal compromise over the past 2 years, but maintains well on his reduced protein diet, Renafood supplement, and periodic BICOM therapies to support his kidneys. There has been no recurrence of the carcinomas.



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
